

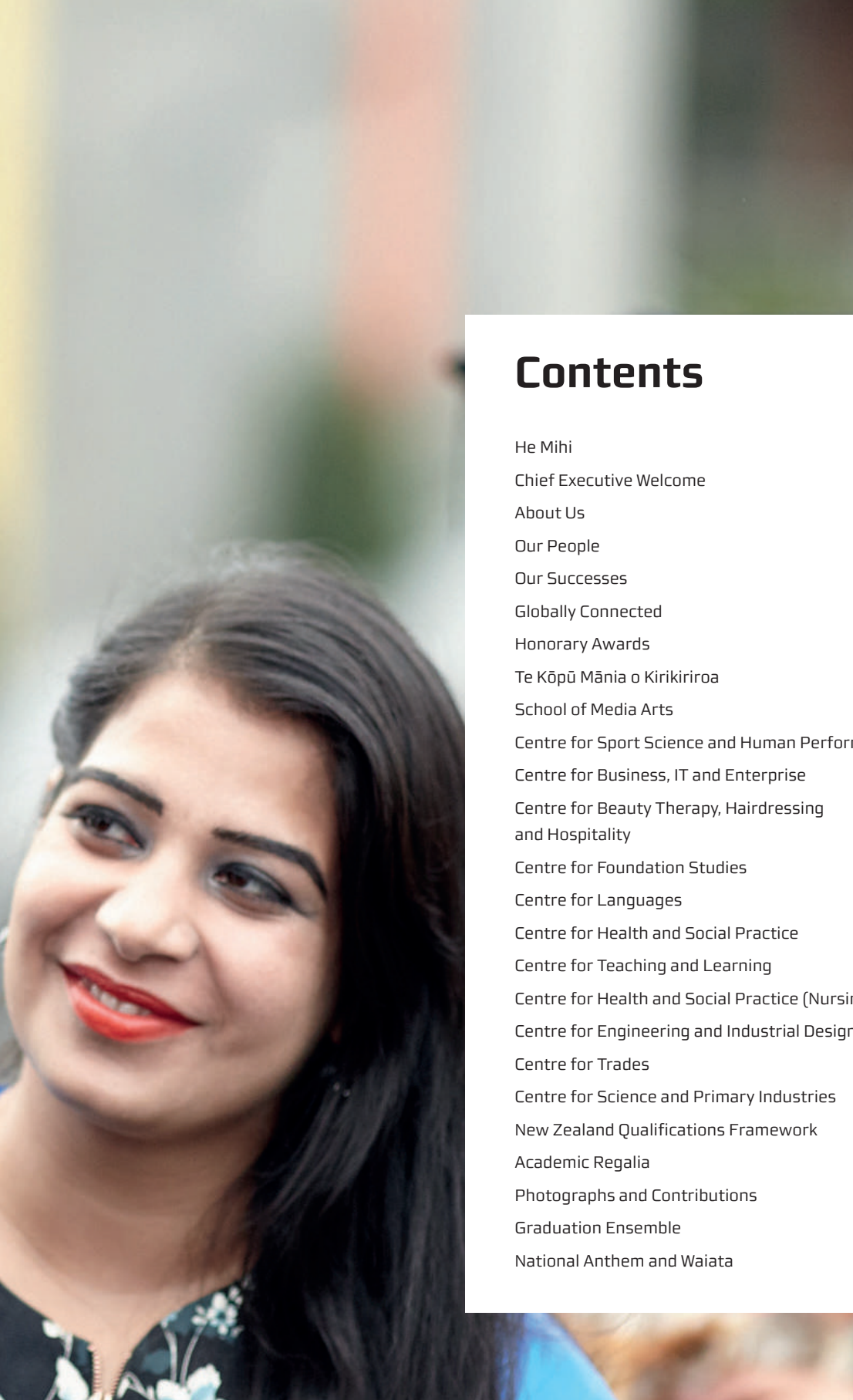

Mary Cave-Palmer, Chair of the Wintec Council, will award graduands their qualifications.

Mary has been a member of the Wintec Council for the last 15 years.

She chaired the Wintec Finance and Risk Committee from 2002-2010, was appointed Deputy Chair of Wintec Council in 2010 and Chair of Council in 2012.

She brings more than 30 years' business experience to the Council with a background in strategic planning, financial management, business advisory services, information technology and management accountability.

Mary is a chartered member of the Institute of Directors in New Zealand, a fellow of Governance New Zealand and a fellow of Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand.

Mark originally trained as a scientist, before moving into professional social work where he gained experience in the health and welfare systems in the United Kingdom, Australia and New Zealand. He then worked in the health sector in Hawke's Bay.

Mark holds a Bachelor of Science (Hons) in Physics and Electronics from the University of Manchester, a Postgraduate Diploma in Social Administration from the University of York and a Masters Degree from the University of North Wales. He also completed a course in strategic management at Harvard University.



Gaye Barton

Gaye Barton, Dean, is our Master of Ceremonies.

As the Dean of Faculty, Gaye is responsible for Wintec's academic direction and delivery across 12 schools and centres and for building strong relationships with employers and the community in the region and beyond.

Gaye has been with Wintec for 19 years and in the role of Dean since 2013. In her previous role, she was Head of the School of Sport and Exercise Science and the Director of the Centre for Foundation Studies.

Gaye plays a key role in Wintec's strong academic performance and external engagement. This includes the successful development of innovative projects and programmes in collaboration with our Employer Engagement Groups and other organisations.

Gaye has a diverse background in the tertiary sector specialising in teaching public relations, organisational communication and interpersonal communication.

Tame Pokaia

As Wintec's Kaumātua, Tame Pokaia opens our graduation ceremonies with a mihi.

Tame is from Ngāti Mahuta and Ngāti Hikairo descent and was born and raised in the small town of Ngāruawāhia, on Tūrangawaewae marae. He regards the marae as his first place of learning. The experiences and learning he gained were invaluable and he regularly shares his experience, knowledge and tribal history relating to Tainui and the Kingitanga.

In the early 1970s he left school and headed for the nearest freezing works at Horotiu.

Twenty years later Tame decided to return to education as an adult student attending night classes at the University of Waikato. He also enrolled as a full time student at Wintec graduating with a teaching diploma in Te Reo Māori. He taught for 10 years in Wintec's Māori studies department. Continuing his study, he returned to the University of Waikato and graduated with a BA with Honours with Māori as his major. Today he is in continual pursuit of higher learning and academic excellence.

He worked for the King's office before returning to Wintec after being appointed Kaumātua in 2009, following the loss of the late Dr Hare Puke – one of Tainui's most prominent leaders.

Tame acknowledges his rich heritage and uses this as his academic motivation.

Tame is also Kaumātua for Mayor Andrew King and the Hamilton City Council.

Our Successes

Our collective success is underpinned by a focus to develop opportunities and qualifications that transition and develop careers in a world that is changing faster than ever before. Here are some recent highlights:

Programmes from Agriculture to IT offer opportunities to upskill

Wintec launched three new and very diverse programmes this year to offer solutions for people already in the workforce to upskill. The Master of Professional Practice offers advanced knowledge and skills to practitioners in health or social practice environments; the Master of Applied Information Technology recognises the need to upskill people already in IT roles to become trained specialists; and the New Zealand Certificate in Agriculture offers a qualification to progress in the dairying industry. Developing new programmes and products is essential to ensure our students are successful and we meet the needs of employers and industry now, and into the future. Advanced training addresses the skills shortage evident in developing industries. For example, the Master of Applied Information Technology will generate highly trained specialists in a rapidly-growing industry where there are jobs but a lack of trained applicants. To offer relevant qualifications, Wintec works with industry partners to create flexible learning opportunities.

Wintec students experience China on Prime Minister's Scholarships

Six Wintec Media Arts students travelled to China last year on the prestigious Prime Minister's Scholarships for Asia. Students, Eliza Webster, Adam Edwards, Mason Holloway, Rosie Stanaway, Christopher Singh and Peter Mark Stevenson – who study a combination of fine arts (painting and sculpture) and photography at Wintec – spent five months at Chengdu University where they studied Media Arts and Chinese Language. The students returned in January after an invaluable experience of Chinese culture with a new international perspective and global connections. The Wintec students were part of a wider group of 124 tertiary students from across New Zealand who went to educational institutes across Asia.

New Wave project celebrates Hamilton's ethnic diversity

Tutors and students at Wintec's School of Media Arts partnered with the Waikato Migrant Resource Centre to create The New Wave, an



interactive, multimedia exhibition that looked at the changing demographic face of Hamilton city at Waikato Museum last year.

The project used photography, moving image, videography, text, sound and digital design. Visitors could listen to recordings of migrants telling their stories; explore three interactive websites to view stories, photographs and video, and view a large touchscreen display to look at the demographic makeup of their suburb. A book on the project retailed at the museum.

The New Wave project involved students and a mix of researchers, technicians and specialists from all areas of the School of Media Arts. More than 16,000 people visited the gallery in the six weeks the show was open to the public.

New programme aims to boost fluency in te reo Māori

A partnership with Waikato-Tainui is the driving force behind a new programme to increase fluency in te reo Māori.

He Reo Arataua Certificate in Te Reo and Tikanga Māori (Waikato-Tainui), a 12-month training scheme developed by Waikato-Tainui, is now delivered at Wintec. The programme is part of the tribe's 25-year strategy to increase fluency for tribal members from 31 per cent to more than 80 per cent (or 50,000 speakers) by 2050. Māori achievement is a strategic priority at Wintec and keeping te reo Māori alive,



encouraging understanding of tikanga and connectedness with marae are important parts of that.

Future engineers get head-start at high school

Wintec has teamed up with Waikato secondary schools to address the national shortage of engineers by moving more young people towards a career in the industry.

Last year, around 30 year 12 and 13 students from Hamilton's Fairfield College and Fraser High School spent two days per week of the school year taking part in Wintec engineering courses. On the other three days, their maths and physics school subjects were specifically adapted for engineering. Wintec also worked with the schools to incorporate projects into the curriculum to teach theory through hands-on application.

The programme is the first of its kind in New Zealand and aims to provide secondary school students the necessary criteria to enter into and succeed in Wintec's New Zealand Diploma in Engineering.

Wintec also partnered with the first EVelocity schools' programme in the Waikato region, where secondary school students are challenged to design and build electric vehicles. Over the year, students built an electric bike or kart powered by a supplied electric motor kit. School teams then competed at the

EVolocivity is a charity dedicated to educating Kiwis on the environmental and economic benefits of electric vehicles and growing youth interest in engineering and technology. The two initiatives fit with Wintec's focus on secondary/tertiary partnerships which help pathway youth to careers in engineering or related trades.

Rotokauri campus transformed after \$3.6m redevelopment

A successful \$3.6m redevelopment of the Rotokauri student hub has achieved larger, more vibrant, flexible and user-friendly spaces for students at our Rotokauri campus.

The project went through an extensive student consultation process in 2015 to ensure the design would create an environment to respond to students' needs.

Now open, the hub is an exciting one-stop shop for students, where they have more choices on the types of spaces they can use for learning and interacting.

The student hub was extended and reconfigured and now has new "activity zones" to allow for private and collaborative study areas, as well as social and recreational spaces. The newly landscaped quad development presents an outdoor space designed for social, recreational and study activities.



Wintec wins technology excellence award

Wintec won a Microsoft award for Excellence in Technology Delivery for business intelligence solutions at the 2016 Microsoft Tertiary ICT conference.

The award recognises the value of business intelligence reporting solutions in improving processes, services and efficiency.

Through the reporting programme, Wintec identified opportunities for growth and diversification in international markets and improvements in internal functions.

The Microsoft Tertiary ICT Excellence Awards judges said they were impressed with Wintec's ability to obtain genuine stakeholder engagement throughout the project and for delivery of real, quantifiable benefits for the institution.

In the past four years, Wintec has won five Microsoft Excellence awards for the delivery of innovative technology solutions.

Mashup of Poi E turns heads

No instruments were used when Media Arts student Alana McDonald recreated the sounds of kiwiana in a video which went viral last year with over 46,000 views, 650 likes, 87 comments and 699 shares on Wintec's Facebook page.

Creating a video was a challenge for Alana, a music student who credits the support of tutors and classmates, and the 'talent' enlisted from her family as essential ingredients to success.



Wintec supported the project by securing legal permissions from the iconic brands featured including Marmite, Weetbix, Red Band gumboots, No.8 wire, L&P and Pineapple Lumps, and of course the legal owners of the much-loved tune Poi E originally made famous by the Patea Māori Club.

Wintec's global connections continue to grow

Wintec continues to expand offshore, setting up global connections for our students, staff and employers. An ongoing focus is to progress existing partnerships and seek new opportunities around the world.

In China, Jinhua Polytechnic Wintec International College is now into its second year with 420 students and 10 staff deployed by Wintec. The students are studying English and Information Technology.

This year Wintec is exploring new opportunities in Mauritius, Thailand, Malaysia, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and South America. International commercial initiatives include New Zealand support for training in the Indonesian geothermal sector. Wintec is also exploring new geothermal opportunities in Japan and East Africa.

New book celebrates our stars for Matariki

A new book celebrating inspiring Māori from across the Waikato was launched at Wintec's



marae, Te Kōpū Mānia o Kirikiriroa as part of its Matariki celebrations.

The book, titled He Huinga Whetū, he Huinga Kōrero, A Gathering of Stars, a Gathering of Stories, is the work of Wintec's journalism, photography and graphic design students. It includes 12 heart-warming stories of Māori graduates and staff who have achieved something special, despite many having faced significant obstacles along the way.

The book, written in English and te reo Māori was an opportunity for students to work on a real-world project where they had the chance to get their work published. Thirty-seven students contributed to the project.

Top young apprentices battle it out at WorldSkills

The WorldSkills 2016 National Competition saw New Zealand's top young apprentices battle it out to be the best in their field to win a place on the Tool Blacks team.

Wintec hosted the successful WorldSkills national competition at the Rotokauri campus in September last year.

During the two-day competition, florists, carpenters, plumbers, mechanics, hairdressers, chefs and more took on a range of 'real-world' projects. The action-packed competition aims to encourage young people to excel in vocational skills.

WorldSkills is an international competition that brings together young people from 75 countries

around the world. Competitors are the best of the best in their respective skill areas. Wintec is a WorldSkills partner.

Student business start-ups get a lift from Soda Inc.

Three groups of Wintec students took part in a pilot scheme with Soda Inc., the Wintec-owned business start-up incubator.

The students each had an existing business or a business idea that they worked to develop during a 12-session part-time incubation programme called Soda Lift.

Through the programme, student teams worked with an experienced business growth advisor who mentored and coached them to develop their opportunity. A number of the students had their work on the Soda Inc. programme credited back to a relevant Wintec qualification.

Soda Inc and Wintec aim to create more opportunities like this for students in 2017 because of the success of this pilot scheme.

Student overcomes adversity to win top exercise award

A stay in a mental health facility after a particularly tough battle with depression and anxiety became a catalyst for change in Shane Way's life.

Fast forward four years and the 27-year-old has completed a Certificate in Fitness Industry

Training, a Certificate in Massage Therapy, a bachelor degree at Wintec and has won Student of the Year at the 2016 Exercise Industry Awards beating nine other finalists from across the country.

Shane says his time at Wintec has "been an amazing experience where I've learnt so much and grown immensely as a person".

Shane's ambition and achievements have now led to a job in the fitness industry as a personal trainer and he will graduate at Wintec with his bachelor degree this year.

Wintec duo work with top rally driver

Two Wintec automotive students received a helping hand from World Rally Championship driver Hayden Paddon that fuelled a passion for a career in rallying.

Matthew Mallett and Tony Pavich and their Wintec tutors spent time as part of Paddon's crew at rallies in Otago and Whangarei last year, gaining invaluable experience as part of Hyundai's Pinnacle mentoring programme.

The duo have both loved motorsport since they were young, so jumped at the opportunity when asked to apply for it by their tutors, and both were ecstatic when they found out they'd been selected.

Both students have come away from their time with Hayden Paddon bitten by the motorsport bug and are now exploring further opportunities in the field.



Wintec trades tutor Brendon Clarke said the pair's experiences had "opened up some real doors for them".

Founded in 2005 as a way of helping New Zealand's elite sportspeople hone their abilities and compete at the highest level, the Pinnacle mentoring programme recognises the passions of those who seek to excel in a wide range of disciplines including art, science, business, sport, politics and leadership.

Life-changing chance to study in Poland

Genima Riini winged her way to Poland last year after being awarded a scholarship under the European Union's Erasmus student exchange programme.

Over four months, Genima 32, studied business at Kozminski University in the Polish capital of Warsaw. Credits from her study have been transferred back to her Bachelor of Applied Management at Wintec.

Wintec has around 15 international exchange partners but this is the first time a student scholarship has been awarded under the Erasmus+ Scholarship through the partnership Wintec has with Kozminski University.

The Erasmus+ Scholarship, funded by the European Union, provides students, trainees, teachers and volunteers around the world with the opportunity to study at higher education institutes in Europe for minimal cost.



Next stop Bahrain for Wintec-trained chef

Joel Miller couldn't be happier with the way his life is going right now. The 19-year-old chef landed a dream job as chef de partie to a royal family in Bahrain.

The Wintec-trained chef "threw himself in the deep end" early in 2016 when he joined the team at Josh Emmett's new Hamilton venture, Madame Woo after graduating from Wintec. The restaurant was new, busy and set a high standard which Joel relished.

After one year out of the classroom and in the kitchen, his new adventure began in January 2017.

Joel's former Wintec tutor Amy Opperman was the link between an executive chef in Bahrain and the opportunity "that has the potential to set Joel up for life". Amy had kept in touch with Joel and knew he was keen to travel and extend his experience.

Joel says Wintec teaches the basics and covers a lot of ground in the two years it takes to become a chef. "You don't realise how much you do actually learn there, then when you go into the field it's up to you how you go about applying those skills.

"If you want to be a good chef and go places, you have to push yourself."

Dr Peter Robinson Honorary Fellowship

Peter Robinson's enduring commitment to science has earned this longstanding member of the commercial science community national significance.

Peter joined the Waikato Technical Institute, (now Waikato Institute of Technology or Wintec) in the late 70s to teach organic and analytical chemistry, and to set up biochemistry and pharmacology for the institute's new nursing course.

In 1973, Peter co-founded the New Zealand Chromatography Group. Chromatography is a versatile method of separating many different kinds of chemical mixtures. Peter was involved with short chromatography courses at Wintec from 1981 until 2013. These courses helped train more than 1200 scientists and technicians from around New Zealand.

The science being taught at Wintec is used in many areas and Peter's reputation as a scientist

with an expertise in chromatography led to him being offered a position by Hill Laboratories in the early 90s. It was an opportunity he couldn't resist. Here Peter could indulge more fully his special interest in analytical chemistry, the environment and work with other scientists and technicians, including some of his former students.

For many years, Peter has been involved in groups developing national standards for quality including the very important areas of drinking water quality and environmental monitoring. Peter's role has extended into providing ongoing advice to environmental clients around New Zealand. He has published more than 25 papers, and has been a frequent speaker here and overseas.

While the Peter Robinson effect has influenced the world of science, he continues to be an integral part of Hill Laboratories. The science-based organisation now employs over 350 staff across four sites in Hamilton and Auckland, Blenheim and Christchurch and has connections in Japan.

Together they are providing services aimed at testing water, soil, plants, and many types of food to improve New Zealand's environment, agricultural performance, and commerce.



Susie Ryan Master of Nursing

Susie Ryan originally had her heart set on university when she left school in the late 60s, but ended up choosing nursing instead. At the

time it was what her parents wanted her to do, and she did not foresee that in the future hundreds of Waikato's nurses and diabetes sufferers would benefit greatly from her career choice. More than four decades later, Susie would lead the Waikato Regional Diabetes Service in Hamilton as Clinical Nurse Manager, and is the founder and the driving force behind globally recognised diabetes education programmes.

A longstanding relationship with Wintec began in the late 1990s when Susie took on the role of Research Nurse for a Waikato-wide project called Discovering Diabetes. The project was set up to look at diagnosis of diabetes in the Waikato. Discovering there was no training for practice nurses, Susie came up with the idea of offering a 12-week course for them to qualify as diabetes nurse specialists. She then developed the programme with Wintec's Centre for Health and Social Practice for delivery from the Waikato Diabetes Clinic.

A penchant for identifying need and creating solutions led Susie to develop training for diabetes care and management. She worked with Wintec's Centre for Health and Social Practice, Postgraduate Team Leader, Helen Nielsen, with a view to this training being offered as part of the Wintec Graduate Nursing Programme. The programme continues to be offered at Wintec and is now delivered from Auckland, Manukau, New Plymouth, Gisborne and Rotorua.

In 1971 Susie completed her nurse training onsite at Waikato Hospital. Nurse training shifted to polytechnics in the 1980s. Susie achieved an Advanced Diploma of Nursing in 1984 and in 1999 was awarded a Bachelor of Nursing at Wintec.

The Waikato Diabetes Clinic has gained recognition from the International Diabetes Federation (IDF) for its programmes. Under Susie's leadership, the expansive Hamilton clinic has 42 staff and offers a comprehensive service for the testing and management of diabetes and globally-recognised training. It's a credit to Susie, who recently stepped down after dedicating a 46-year career to making a significant difference to the quality of other peoples' lives.



Liam Messam

Master of Science - Sport and Exercise Science

Liam Messam is well-known around the world for his rugby prowess. He's arguably one of the most influential players in Chiefs' history; captaining national rugby teams, as well as being a former All Black, and two-time Commonwealth Games Sevens gold medallist.

Liam is the most capped player for the Chiefs, with 130 matches to his name and has played 43 games for the All Blacks, and 21 for the New Zealand Sevens team. In 2012 and 2013, he was awarded the Tom French Cup as Māori Player of the Year.

The award-winning, skilled ball-runner and abrasive loose forward, also cares a lot about the welfare of our young people. For many years, Liam has worked within our community on numerous youth-orientated initiatives.

Liam also has a strong link to the South Pacific Institute (SPI), a local private training organisation based in Hamilton. At SPI he has acted in the capacity as teacher, mentor and role model, investing hours of his personal time.

Based in Hamilton, he has also directed his energy off the field into Team Messam, a youth initiative he created. A natural leader, known for his perseverance and hard work, Messam has facilitated youth at risk workshops, youth achievement workshops and is working to get our youth active for a better future.

The Messam Indigenous Sevens tournament allows people from Pacific Island cultures to engage in sport and celebrate their identities. Team Messam has also used rugby to provide

the opportunity for youth to grow through international travel, supporting them with fundraising and sponsorship.

An ambassador for the Adoption Option Society Group, Liam represents those in closed adoptions, providing a face and identity to this organisation.

Born in Rotorua and of Māori descent, Liam affiliates to the Ngāi Tūhoe iwi. He credits his adoptive parents Lewis and Wanda Messam as the inspiration for his sporting success and his motivation to help young people. For more than 40 years, Lewis and Wanda Messam opened their home to more than 400 children. Liam Messam's sporting achievements are remarkable, however his efforts to develop youth and indigenous people are equally impressive. He's also a husband and father to two young sons, Jai and Bodie.



Te Radar (Andrew J Lumsden) Master of Arts

Waikato-born Te Radar has made a significant contribution to the nation's appetite for thought provoking entertainment. He makes outstanding comedy and presents award-winning documentaries – often at the same time.

Not many people know Te Radar's real name, but there were too many Andrews when Andrew J Lumsden attended Otago University, so the nickname Radar was born. He discovered his love of comedy while failing law and took up drama instead. Te Radar has been mining comedy and wry observation from his interest in travel, culture and history ever since.

Te Radar has become a household name in New Zealand as an award-winning satirist,

documentary-maker, writer, stage and screen director. He has a rare talent for combining laughter and documentary making, from intrepid journeying where he survived a scorpion attack in Mali, to stand-up comedy, and sustainable living shows *Off the Radar* and *Radar's Patch*.

Since 2006 Te Radar has won eight major media, screen and comedy awards and was nominated for four more.

The presenter of several TVNZ programmes, *Radar Across the Pacific*, *Global Radar*, *Radar's Patch*, *Off the Radar*, *Homegrown* and *Hidden In The Numbers*, he was nominated as best presenter on New Zealand television in 2012, 2009 and 2007. He presented and directed the documentary *Our Far South* on Antarctica and joined the Royal New Zealand Ballet in 2013 to narrate the touring production, *Peter and the Wolf*.

A gifted writer, Te Radar has twice won the Qantas Media Award for Best Humour Column for his New Zealand Herald columns and he published a book of his experiences with sustainable living entitled *Off The Radar: A Man, A Plan, and a Paddock*.

Te Radar was the 1998 recipient of the Billy T Award For Comedy Excellence and the 2009 Fred Award for Comedy Achievement from the NZ International Comedy Festival. In 2008 he received the Kevin Smith Memorial Cup for Artistic Achievement. He has won Best Local Show at the New Zealand International Comedy Festival three times.

For 15 years Te Radar has provided a satirical view of the week on National Radio's Nine to Noon each Friday. He has created shows for radio. A standout is the Radio New Zealand four part series on his travels through the Arab-Israeli conflict in 2004, where he can claim to be the last Kiwi journalist to interview Yassar Arafat. His career to date suggests there will be a lot more surprises from this talented and prolific New Zealander.

Academic Regalia Korowai

Wintec’s academic regalia dates back to the establishment of Europe’s earliest universities. Historically a gown and hood were practical items worn daily over tunic and trousers (usually dark coloured), and were lined in wool, fur or silk according to the season. Over the centuries the length and cut of the gown and sleeves have changed with fashion and today, are stylised rather than practical items.

The bonnet and cap are 15th century lay fashions based on the pileus, a head-dress common in the Middle Ages. The pileus quadratus (square cap) is the trencher or mortar board. Trencher is a flat board used for serving or cutting food. When turned upside down, the cap resembles a bowl on a trencher. It also looks very similar to a bricklayer’s square, flat mortar board.

Today, regalia is a symbol of academic achievement and excellence.

To wear a korowai, or cloak, is to be honoured on a special occasion and for many Māori graduands and their whānau, graduation day is one such occasion.

Traditionally the korowai is a dress cloak ornamented with black cord tags (hukahuka) and coloured borders (tāniko). Kahu huruhuru, or feather cloak, is another cloak used for special occasions.

Most korowai are made from fine, soft fibre (muka) stripped from flax leaves. This muka is hand-rolled into threads for weaving. Feathers or coloured tags are incorporated as the garment is woven.

Korowai or kahu huruhuru are treasured family items, often handed down through many generations. To wear such a treasure, or tāonga, is a great honour and privilege, enhancing the wearer’s honour and bestowing prestige on that person’s whānau and tribal groups.

In the context of the graduation ceremony, the cloak serves as acknowledgement of the wearer’s achievements – overcoming many challenges on their journey seeking knowledge and growth.
