




HOW TO GET THERE

ENTRY CRITERIA

An undergraduate degree in Health and or Social Practice or related discipline or a suitable portfolio of experience.
For Health and Social Practice and Professional Supervision – two years of practice experience and IELTS of 7 in all bands.
For Midwifery – one year of practice experience, registered with Midwifery Council of New Zealand and a current Annual Practising Certificate.



RELEVANT LEARNING

These programmes will extend the existing qualifications pathways and will allow higher level professional development that is interprofessional. It is relevant to practitioners from a wide range of practice contexts and the resulting interprofessional interaction of health and social services practitioners will enhance and strengthen service delivery in the region.

FUNDING

Midwives who are engaged in formal postgraduate education (at Level 8 or above on the NZQA framework) are entitled to apply for a grant towards the cost of their postgraduate study. These grants are funded by Health Workforce New Zealand (HWNZ) and are administered by NZCOM to subsidise the cost of fees and travel (if required).

It will enable you to participate effectively in the health or social practice workforce as highly skilled, knowledgeable and confident practitioners able to work across professional boundaries to respond to real world problems.

HOW YOU STUDY

The focus of learning in the programme will include working reflexively with clients and communities within differing interprofessional collaborations and relationships. It will enable you to engage in transformative learning strategies that build on the strengths, knowledge, skills and relationships acquired as experienced practitioners. This practice based learning approach will enhance your ability to engage in future professional and work related challenges.

MIDWIFERY PRAXIS I

HSHS815

Duration: One semester

Credits: 30 Level: 8

Location: Hamilton City Campus

Dates*: Semester 1

OVERVIEW

This module will enable midwives to develop knowledge and capabilities to critically analyse own midwifery practice within situations of complexity. Midwives will critique the range of societal and epidemiological factors that influence midwifery care. Through reflexivity and critical review of research, and individual midwifery practice, the midwife will further develop and maximise their midwifery care.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Critically analyse social determinants and epidemiological factors of health which influence maternity care.
- Critically examine midwifery practice to analyse the challenges in detection and appropriate management of complexities, which may impact on maternity care.
- Consistently evaluate own practice knowledge and capabilities related to best practice evidence to enable a critical analysis of midwifery practice.
- Critically analyse the application of ethical and legal midwifery frameworks for practice, within the context of individual practice.

OVERVIEW

This module will enable the midwife to develop knowledge and capabilities through critical, contextualised analysis of the complexities of midwifery practice. Midwives will critically reflect on the changing demographics of women and social infrastructure within society, which influence care provision. Using reflexivity and research, the midwife will influence and lead ways of working that progress service provision and the midwifery profession.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Critically analyse maternity care considering policies and legislation, and the application of the Treaty of Waitangi in post-colonial Aotearoa/ New Zealand.
- Demonstrate leadership in midwifery practice by critiquing research and policy and disseminate recommendation within the profession.
- Critically examine midwifery sustainability in practice to identify and disseminate innovative practice.
- Work interprofessionally to create alliances that enable advocacy and support for women and their babies
