Overview of Year 1

By the end of year one, students will have completed four modules within this programme: tourism, cookery, hairdressing and beauty therapy. They also had the potential to achieve 31 Level 2 credits towards their NCEA Level 2 at school, in the Service Industries Vocational Pathway.

Where to from here

At the successful completion of this year, students have the opportunity to select two specialisations completed in year one for further study (details of each of these programmes are attached) while achieving credits towards NCEA Level 3 at school:

- Tourism Hamilton *City* Campus
- Hairdressing Hamilton *City* Campus
- Beauty Therapy Hamilton *City* Campus
- Cookery Hamilton *Rotokauri* Campus

Important Notes

- In order to re-enrol; students must return the following forms via your school:
 - Complete and sign the attached 'Decision Form'
 - Update all contact details and sign the attached Wintec 'Returning Student Form'
- This is an application for enrolment only and acceptance is not guaranteed. Once your enrolment is accepted, you will receive an induction flyer as confirmation from your school outlining the dates and information for your programme in 2017.
- We have strict requirements for students to meet in year one, in order to gain acceptance into the year 2 programme. These requirements are:
 - o Achievement of at least 80% of the available credits in your year 1 programme
 - Achievement of 100% of the credits in your chosen specialisation
 - Attendance of 80% or higher at all points of the year
 - Appropriate behaviour throughout the year, or effective resolution of inappropriate behaviour.
- As part of a Secondary Tertiary Partnership programme (STP), students <u>must</u> stay enrolled at school throughout the year to attend the academy, and be committed to attending and completing all class work at both school and Wintec.
- All students re-enrolling must have achieved formal numeracy and literacy level 1 (20 credits) requirement in either achievement or unit standards. If this requirement is not met, entry may be granted at the discretion of your secondary school and the Youth Pathways Delivery Manager (please discuss with your school first if you fit into this criteria).
- It is expected candidates will not yet have achieved the National Certificate in Educational Achievement Level 3 (NCEA L3) and are currently working towards achieving this qualification.
- The WTA Student Code of Conduct you signed at the beginning of year one will continue to apply in year two; please contact us if you would like another copy.
- Where applicable, transport will be funded by the WTA through the Ministry of Education. This is coordinated by your secondary school and WTA. Please discuss with your school, should you have any queries about transport.
- All classes will be held from 8.30am 3.00pm on your Wintec nominated day of the week.
- Your point of contact during this re-enrolment process is your school's Career Advisor. Please direct any queries you may have including returning your forms, to them.
